SUBJECT: Installation Policy Memorandum #41, Environmental Policy

1. REFERENCES.

- a. Army Regulation 200-1, Environmental Protection and Enhancement, 13 Dec 07.
- b. International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 14001:2004(E), Environmental Management Systems (EMS).

2. PURPOSE. This memorandum sets forth the U.S. Army Garrison (USAG), Fort Greely Alaska (FGA) environmental policy.

3. POLICY. FGA will integrate environmental considerations into all aspects of installation operations, planning, and mission-related functions. FGA will continually evaluate and improve environmental protection, pollution prevention, and environmental enhancement efforts through an inclusive process that welcomes the participation and involvement of the entire Fort Greely community. Responsible environmental management is a shared responsibility of all Garrison directorates, tenant organizations, contractors, and residents at Fort Greely. To further FGA's environmental objectives, FGA will:

- a. Comply with all applicable environmental laws, regulations, requirements and policies.
- b. At least annually and through a collaborative process with directorates, tenants, contractors, and residents, evaluate ongoing activities and conditions for their environmental impacts and implement measures that will mitigate or eliminate negative impacts and enhance positive ones.
- c. At least annually, perform a managerial level review of FGA's environmental management process and make indicated changes to enhance performance.
- d. Make this policy available to all FGA personnel, residents and the public and provide a forum and means for any interested person to be involved in FGA's environmental program.

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4. RESPONSIBILITIES.

a. All personnel and residents at FGA are responsible for conducting their activities in an environmentally responsible manner.

b. Managerial levels of FGA Directorates, tenant organizations, and contractors are responsible for ensuring the activities of their organization and personnel are consistent with FGA's environmental policy and requirements. Managerial personnel will actively participate in FGA's environmental management process and encourage participation by their employees.

c. The FGA Environmental Office will support the implementation of this policy, maintain documentation of FGA's environmental management process, and serve as the primary point of contact for environmental matters.

5. APPLICABILITY. This installation policy supersedes USAG-FGA Installation Policy #41, 01 August 2008.
