MEMORANDUM FOR DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Installation Policy Memorandum #14-07, Prohibition of Government Owned Firearms in Fort Greely Facilities

1. Purpose. This memorandum establishes policy prohibiting the carry of government owned firearms into installation common use / public use facilities.
2. Policy. The carry of government owned firearms into following installation facilities is prohibited.
  - a. AAFES Post Exchange (PX).
  - b. AAFES Barber Shop.
  - c. FMWR Child & Youth Services Facilities.
  - d. FMWR Community Activities Center.
  - e. FMWR Outdoor Recreation Services.
  - f. FMWR Gymnasium.
  - g. Defense Commissary Agency Facility.
  - h. Dining Facility (DFAC).
3. Definition. Government owned firearm is defined as any firearm (such as M9, M16, M4, or shotgun), owned by a military or government civilian unit, organization, or activity, issued to an individual soldier or government employee for their personal use during training or in connection with their individual duty position.
4. Responsibility.
  - a. Directorate of Plans, Mobilization, Training and Security (DPTMS). DPTMS has overall responsibility for notifying training units of this policy.

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(1) DPTMS will coordinate policy dissemination with Fort Wainwright Range Control for units training in DTA.

(2) DPTMS will ensure that organizations coordinating training support requirements through FGA DPTMS are provided this policy memorandum.

b. Directorate of Emergency Services (DES). DES has overall responsibility for enforcing this policy.

c. Unit, Organization or Activity Commanders, Directors or Chiefs of units attending training in DTA or on FGA:

(1) Advise Soldiers and / or Civilians assigned to their units of this policy.

(2) Ensure provisions are made for the proper storage and/or safekeeping of arms, ammunition and explosives (AA&E), IAW AR 190-11, when unit members are utilizing installation facilities.

5. Compliance.

a. Military personnel who fail to comply with this memorandum may be subject to judicial or non-judicial action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ), or appropriate administrative action.

b. Government civilian employees who fail to comply with this memorandum may be subject to disciplinary and/or administrative action according to appropriate civilian personnel rules or regulations.

6. Exemptions.

a. Department of the Army Civilian Police/Security Guards, Military Police and Civilian law enforcement personnel while in the performance of official law enforcement or security duties may possess or use duty weapons and ammunition, as prescribed by applicable laws or the orders of lawful superiors, within these facilities.

b. FMWR employees may carry and use non-appropriated fund appropriated weapons and ammunition within the Fort Greely skeet range.

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c. Military units under the operational control of the Garrison Commander, while in the performance of official law enforcement or security duties, may possess or use duty weapons and ammunition within these facilities, in support of contingency operations on the installation as dictated by the mission.

7. The Garrison Commander may, without notice, modify or suspend this policy.
